Cantu says program is 'hungry' for some on-field success



The past couple of seasons have been ones during which youthful Wylie players have gained valuable on-field experience.

Now, in 2015, head coach Jonathan Cantu sees all that experience paying off in a team that's ready to compete for a district crown.

Returners expected to make an impact are seniors Darius Carter (shortstop) and John Kendrick (outfield), as well as Ryan Rigsby and Ricky Freeman.

Among them are juniors Nick Dayton, Peyton Graham and Levi Hon, with the latter two moving up from a junior varsity

team that lost just one district contest in 2014, the coach said.

District 10-5A play begins St. Patrick's Day (March 17) at home against McKinney.

"It seems like every year we're in a buzz saw district," Cantu said. "Everybody is going to be good, and everybody has a shot. We feel we have just as good a shot as anybody else. Our focus is one game at a time and not look ahead."
